### Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Small spill

#### Precautions for safe handling

Protective measures

# Advice on general occupational hygiene

Eliminate all ignition sources. Separate from oxidizing materials. Keep container tightly closed and sealed until ready for use. ## Appropriate engineering controls


